

## Lost at Sea Queens Co. - Not Determined - March 2, 2022 - 27 Individuals

Bell, Frederick 1837 vessel ? Born June 10, 1795 at New Dublin, Lun. Co. Ref. Dutch Reform Ch., Lun. Lost at Sea April 25, 1837 S/o Alex and Maria TB Smith # 16562 V-819 page 186

Boucher, Ambrose ? Vessel ? Born ? May not be Lost at Sea Born Liverpool Ref. Family Tombstone at Trinity Ang. Ch., Liverpool Drowned at Baltimore Sea at 14 years of age S/O Richard Boucher who died at sea in 1859 on Vessel "Lucknow" on voyage from Liverpool to Barbados. Richard`s wife was Martha (Dunn). Ref. TB Smith Richard Boucher #6543 V-820 page 261

Conrad, Tyson 1913 Vessel "ASPINET" at age 45. Born c1868 Included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list. Not found in JC Conrad genealogy or the 1911 Census.

Cottrell, Richard 1929 Vessel "Charles L" Included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list which also includes some nearby Lunenburg Co. communities.

Halan, 1882 Vessel ? Two identical names are included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list as being lost in November 1882 and being from East Port Medway. Note - An Isaac Allen is on our Unqualified list as being lost at sea in Nov. 1882 on the schooner "ARDELLA" and was cited in the QCM card files as 1882. The Vessel sank in 1891 however it was registered in Shelburne and sailed from Lockeport in 1891. Ref. On the Rocks web site- vessels. Allen was from Shelburne Co.

Halan, 1882 Vessel ? Two identical names are included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list as being lost in November 1882 and being from East Port Medway. Note - An Isaac Allen is on our Unqualified list as being lost at sea in Nov. 1882 on the schooner "ARDELLA" and was cited in the QCM card files as 1882. The Vessel sank in 1891 however it was registered in Shelburne and sailed from Lockeport in 1891. Ref. On the Rocks web site - vessels. Allen was from Shelburne Co.

Huskins, 1778 Vessel ? Two identical names included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list as drowned Feb. 1778. Unable to locate anything in the QCM card file or Cemetery listings. A census search is problematic at that time. No results on Lost at sea sites or Genealogy sites.

John, Alexander (Johnson?) 1890 Vessel "J S LAMPREY" Alexander was Lost at Sea March 20, 1890 at Nantucket Shoals, being knocked overboard by the sail. Ref. Advance April 2, 1890. Card file fits "John". His residence location is still unknown. Note - Schooner J S Lamprey was a partial loss at Windsor N.S. on June 27, 1912 being stranded. Vessel was registered at New York. Ref. On the Rocks web site - vessels

Lohnes, James 1873 Vessel ? Lost at sea Aug. 1873 as a young sailor according to the Port Medway Lost at Sea list. Note - Cemeteries - no info as well as census.

McGowan, John C 1878 Vessel ? Possibly, is actually David McGowan as McGowan`s resided at Summerville. Not located in TB Smith files or QCM card files. See Sarah Jane Tupper (Mailman) McGowan for additional spousal info.

McGowan, David 1878 Vessel ? Possibly, is actually John C McGowan as McGowan`s resided at Summerville. Not located in TB Smith files or QCM card files. See Sarah Jane Tupper (Mailman) McGowan for additional spousal info.

McIntosh, Alexander ? Vessel ? Lost at Sea. Ref. TB Smith Vol 847 page 355/531 Note - there was an Alexander McIntosh who died at Lydgate, Shelb. Co. in 1924.

Perley, James ? Vessel ? Lost at Sea . Assumed to be born 1787 at Noxford USA ? Ref. TB Smith Vol. 851 page 258/372.

Perry, J H 1857 Vessel "Fame" This individual is included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list as being lost at sea.

Randall, Joseph Stienman ? Vessel ? TB Smith Vol. 852 page 241/687 states Liverpool Lost at Sea and born Oct. 30, 1796. Note - Longs Annals includes info on another Joseph Randall who dies at age 31 on Dec. 31, 1851, having been born approximately 1820.

Selig, George Gilbert 1867 Vessel ? Apparently drowned Dec. 6, 1867 at 10 years of age at Port Medway, residing Mill Village? Ref. Deaths records 69-M-10. Also NSHVS - son of Edward and Maria.

Shangster, Al ? Vessel ? No further info as to origin, but was added as a Lost at Sea candidate early in the data gathering process from an unrecorded source. Not found in TB Smith, Longs Annals, or QCM Card files.

Shangster, William ? Vessel ? No further info as to origin but was added as a Lost at Sea candidate early in the data gathering process from an unrecorded source. Not found in TB Smith, Longs Annals, or QCM Card files.

Snow, Jabez \_\_\_\_\_ AFT 1850 Vessel ? Resident of Liverpool. Ref. by TB Smith Volume 855 Image 813 that Joshua was the son of Joshua Snow and Mary Doane of Roseway Shelburne County . States Lost at Sea. Genealogy research states Jabez was born July 21, 1789. Ref. in Longs Annals page 697 states Captain of the Brig. "IDA" c1820`s and page 1178 that Jabez was the owner of the Barq. "SEA BIRD" in 1850 as Liverpool registrations.

Vaughn, Leander \_\_\_\_\_ 1873 Vessel ? This individual is included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list as being lost at sea. TB Smith records and Longs Annals both provided no info. A Census search was not productive.

Wolf, John Nicholas \_\_\_\_\_ ? Vessel ? This individual is included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list at the end, as being lost at sea and a resident of West Berlin. Local research has not uncovered clarification in TB Smith, Longs Annals, or genealogy searches of this individual or his residence.

Unknown \_\_\_\_\_ 1842 Vessel "FAME" This individual is included on the Port Medway Lost at Sea list as being Lost at Sea. Note - Pearl D Kinney was lost at Sea in 1842 on the Brig. "ENTERPRISE" and not on the Fame. Determining the name of this individual is still unknown. A list of all lost on the FAME would hopefully resolve this question.

Unknowns (4) \_\_\_\_\_ 1892 Vessel "CASHIER" There are 4 crew members remaining with their names and residence location being an unknown, who were Lost at Sea in August 1892. Three other crew are also unknown, however they are known to be from Voglers Cove, and not residents of Queens. Searches of many internet databases, including TB Smith and Longs Annals were not productive. A complete list of those lost from the CASHIER would be helpful as 19 crew were known to be lost. Only 15 of those lost crew are accounted for. James Mason and 3 others unknown from Voglers Cove make up the 4 unknown crew from Voglers Cove as part of that 15. Four additional names still remain unknown pertaining to their names, or their location of residence. This Lunenburg vessel was 107 tons as reported in the Boston Journal appearing on Sept. 1892. A majority of lost remaining crew are expected to be from Lahave as none were previously found to be residents of Queens County. See info below.

"More Solutions to the Mystery: Author's Notes" While digging through archival papers some time after my initial conversation with Forsey, I located a reference

to the loss of the LaHave schooner Cashier. News of Cashier's wreck reached Nova Scotia in early September. By September 12, 1892, an article in the Halifax Herald reported Cashier had been lost with crew. ”

The one hundred seven ton Cashier, one of the finest vessels of the Nova Scotia fishing fleet, carried nineteen men. She was owned in LaHave by T.A. Wilson and Reinhardt Brothers and had been built in 1888 at Conquerall. Captain Reinhardt had previously captained the schooner Cletia which his brother Benjamin now commanded. Three of the captain's brothers worked in LaHave; one was the collector of customs and two were in business.

Several of Cashier's crew, many of whom lived in LaHave and area, were identified: **(15 appear below – 4 more are unknown - name or residence)**

- Captain Albert Reinhardt, age 32 (not Queens)
- Two Legay brothers, Enus and Titus (not Queens)
- George Richard, leaving a family (not Queens)
- Andrew (or Lewis Leander) Mosher, age 19, of West Dublin (not Queens)
- Eli Corkum, son of Sam Corkum, West Dublin (not Queens)
- Spencer Remby, West Dublin (not Queens)
- Howard Conrad (not Queens)
- Benjamin Wagner (not Queens)
- Four men from Vogler's Cove (whose names were not given - one is James Mason and the other 3 would also not be from Queens)
- Pernette, James W. captain's brother-in-law; (not Queens)
- Wentzell of LaHave, about 50 years, leaving a family of 9. (not Queens)
- **4 more of unknown name and location of residence remain to total 19**
